Workmen dismantling the art, gallery staff, passersby and shopkeepers shared jokes in the happy afterglow of the festival and its artistic endeavour. The remaining artworks, some even dislocated from their intended place, took on a life of their own against a variety of architecture, such is the power of art and architecture to enrich our experience, and this is what I was interested in capturing."

Article 25, the charity managing sustainable architectural projects in areas of extreme poverty or disaster, is based on UN Charter on Human Rights 25.1 everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of himself and of his family, including food, clothing, housing...
